

Movement from Denmark to Norway

At some point before 459 AD your ancestors moved to Norway. These are the events your ancestors would have lived through in Norway.

The Nordic Iron Age

Between 500 BC and 800 AD, Norway was ruled by local leaders in a period known as the Nordic Iron Age. During this period Norway was relatively stable; it operated under an extended family-based clan system with chieftains ruling over groups of tribes. Agricultural productivity increased and the Norwegian tribes would trade furs and skins with Romans. A writing system was developed, known as runes. People migrated from Germany, Sweden, and Denmark and Central Europe to Norway due

to Germanic tribes migrating through Scandinavia and looking for new lands to colonize during the Migration period. At the same time, populations moved from Norway to places like Central Europe with the migration of Gothic Tribes, Lombards, Heruli and Varangians to Russia and the rest of Europe, especially during the Great Migration.
